Children 5 and under free. Competitors will not be charged for attending additional sessions. Gate entry charges should be included in pre- meet information. (7/9/03) (7/17/08) (6/22/17) (6/28/22)

The RACC will do the draw for all Regionals by computer program before the first competition day. The athletes starting events are subject to change to expedite the competition after the coaches meeting. (6/20/13)

Rotation sheets will no longer be printed for coaches at regionals. After the coaches meeting a revised rotation sheet will be taped to the head table and coaches may take a picture with their phone or tablet. (6/28/22)

The Meet Director will pay a fee of \$10 for Level 6/7/8 and \$15 for Xcel per athlete from Regional Championships to the regional account. (7/27/01)(6/22/17)

Due to the expense of food in outside facility and the fact that coaches receive per diem from their gym, no meals will be provided to coaches at Regional Competitions. Meet directors may provide, but are not required to provide, vouchers for meals or a green room with snacks. (6/18/15)

Region 8 will pay half the cost of awards at Level 9/10 Regional Championships, the other half to be paid by the Meet Host. The Xcel and Level 6, 7 & 8 Meet Host pays the entire awards expenses. (7/27/01)(6/15)

Region 8 will give all-around awards to 50%+1 of competitors at Level 6, 7, 8, 9 & 10 Regionals, or at Level 9 & 10 to all athletes qualifying to Eastern/JO Nationals, whichever is greater. Region 8 will give awards to 50% +1 of competitors at Xcel Regionals. (7/27/01) (6/06) (6/15) (6/23)
Ties will be broken for all events but not for All-Around. Ties will be awarded for All-Around (6/28/22)

All graduating seniors at Regional Meets will be presented with flowers by the region. (1/4/97)

If a gymnast's Regional Meet entry is NOT turned in online by the deadline, in order to enter the gymnast(s) in the Regional Meet, the following penalty will apply to the coach:

- A \$50 late fee per gymnast (in addition to the regular entry fee) must be paid to the Region 8 Committee. (6/7/18)
- Fines must be received prior to competition day. (6/7/00) (6/28/06) (6/16/16)

Injury petitions are accepted for Level 9 & 10 regionals. All petition information must be sent to RTCC with a copy to RJOCC and RACC. Online entries must be marked petition. (7/3/02)

RACC must be notified by e-mail of all petitions by Monday midnight after State Championships. (5/08) (6/16/16)

Refunds will be issued for scratches which have a doctor's excuse and occur 7 days or more prior to competition. (6/27/19)

If there are judge's travel problems due to unforeseen circumstances at a Regional competition, the decision regarding reimbursement to the affected judge(s) will be made by the Regional officers (RACC, RTCC, and RJOCC) or (RACC, RTCC, and RXCC). The meet host is required to honor this decision financially. (6/22/17)

Xcel and 6/7/8 State teams to be filled even if athletes score is below the State Cut-off score for that Division/Level. Once a team is filled all additional

athletes must achieve the State Cut-off score to attend Regionals. (6/22/17)

Meet hosts are required to provide private hotel rooms for judges at all Region 8 Regionals. (6/27/19)

The Region 8 Committee requires that Level 9/10 Regionals provide a single room for each judge. To offset the cost of single rooms for judges Region 8 will waive the \$10 per athlete competition fee Level 9/10 Meet Host pays to Region 8. (6/7/18)

There will be no open workout at any Region 8 Regionals. (7/17/08)

LEVEL 9/10 REGIONALS

Entry fee \$130.00. Qualification score is 35.00. Petition score 36.00. IES Score is 9.5 for level 9 and 9.25 for level 10. IES may petition at 0.25 higher than qualification score. (6/16/16) (6/27/19) (6/23)

The RACC will set the meet schedule (order of age groups) to facilitate the schedule of the entire competition (7/9/03)

The RACC will do the draw for Level 9/10 Regionals by computer program before the first competition day. The athletes starting events are subject to change to expedite the competition after the coaches meeting. (6/20/13)

Specialist category at Level 9/10 Regionals is allowed. The gymnast no longer needs to declare as a specialist by state meet entry and may compete in four events at state meet. Refer to individual state meet guidelines for state specialist qualifying scores. Entry fees for Regional competition remain the same as fees for all around gymnasts. (7/17/08) (6/7/18) (6/23)

Individual event specialist are allowed to petition to ONLY Level 10 Regionals if she had attained a score of 9.55 from a meet earlier in the season. No petitions allowed for Level 9. (6/7/18)

LEVEL 6/7/8 REGIONALS

The entry fee for Level 6/7/8 Regionals be \$130.00 with \$10 directed to Region 8. (12/19/08) (6/14/23)

Meet hosts are required to provide private hotel rooms for judges at all Region 6/78 Regionals. (6/27/19)

If an athlete for Level 6/7/8 State Team is unable to compete in the State Team session at Regionals due to religious or valid unforeseen reasons, they must declare to the State Chairperson by the State Meet entry deadline their intent to not compete as a member of the State Team. The athlete may compete as an All Star if she qualifies within the state's percentage. (6/19/14)

The RACC will do the draw for Level 6/7/8 Regionals by computer program before the first competition day. The athletes starting events are subject to change to expedite the competition after the coaches meeting. (6/20/13)

State teams are to be filled even if the athletes score is below the State Cut-off score for that Division/Level. Once a team is filled all additional athletes must achieve the State Cut-off score to attend Regionals. (6/22/17)

If a state with only 8 qualified athletes has a scratch, they may replace that athlete to fill the spot on the state team. (6/28/22)

The top 4 scores on each event will count for team championship at Level 6/7/8 Regionals. (6/14/07)

If a tie for state team occurs at Level 6/7/8 Regionals Team competition the tie will not be broken. (7/9/03)

Level 6/7/8 team alternate will be placed in any slots that become available up to the start of warm-ups of the first session of competition. (6/30/99)

The Regional 6/7/8 Team leotard will be the same for all the states. All states should have the same warm-up, but each state may choose the design of state on back of the jacket. (12/18/09)

Each session will be divided into three age groups. Awards will be given for 50% of athletes in each age group. No age group will be more than 16 athletes. Ties will be broken for all events but not for All-Around. All places will be awarded for All-Around (6/9/05) (6/28/06) (6/14/07) (6/28/22)

All regional state team competitors will receive plaques at Level 6/7/8 Regionals. The plaques will be presented prior to the team competition for photos to be taken. The teams finishing first through third will receive additional plates to attach to the plaques reflecting their respective finishing positions at the awards ceremony. (7/3/02)

The number of gymnasts at Level 8 Regionals is 360 +64 Team + all ties. The number of team members is 64 (8 per state with 4 scores counting for team). The number of gymnasts at Level 7 Regionals is 296 +64 Team + all ties. The number of team members is 64 (8 per state with 4 scores counting for team). There are no petitions accepted to Level 7 Regionals. Each state turns into RACC the number of Level 7 athletes in their state with 33.00 AA. A percentage for each state is figured for the 360 places for the 33.00 AA number by the designated deadline, from all 8 states. (6/7/00) (12/19/03) (6/16/16) (6/22/17)(6/7/18)

All Level 7 Regional athletes will compete on Friday in two gyms. The Level 7 team session will be last session Friday. (6/11/09) (8/9/12) (6/16/18)(6/27/19) Top four scores count for Level 7 team scores at Level 7 Regionals (6/11/09)

The number of gymnasts at Level 6 Regionals is 296 +64 Team + all ties. The number of team members is 64 (8 per state with 4 scores counting for team). There are no petitions accepted to Level 6 Regionals. Each state turns into RACC the number of Level 6 athletes in their state with 33.00 AA. A percentage for each state is figured for the 360 places from all 8 states. (6/7/00) (12/19/03) (6/16/16) (6/22/17) (6/7/18)

All Level 6 Regionals will be on Sunday in two gyms. The Level 6 Team session will be the last session Sunday. (6/16/16/) (6/7/18)(6/27/19)

Beginning with 2019 Levels 6,7,8 Regionals the Region 8 Committee voted to dispense with the scratch and replace procedure. (6/7/18)

No petitions are allowed at Level 6/78 Regionals

A fee of \$50/gymnast will be assessed to a club who has indicated at State Meet that a gymnast would participate at Regionals and subsequently fails to enter the gymnast. This policy does not apply to petitions, sickness, or injury. The fee is to be paid by the club to their SACC. Clubs must be in good standing with their State and Region 8 to be eligible for team awards at any state Competitions the next season. If the fee is not paid, the club will not be in Good Standing and therefore not eligible for state meet team awards at any State championships in the following season. (7/15/21)

XCEL REGIONALS

The entry for Xcel Regional be set at \$130 per gymnast with \$25 directed to Region 8. (6/11/09) (6/22/17) (7/15/21) (6/23)

All states that have enough qualified athletes to field a state team must compete as a state team in that Division. (6/27/19)

If an athlete for Xcel State Team is unable to compete in the State Team session at Regionals due to religious or valid unforeseen reasons, they must declare to the State Chairperson by the State Meet entry deadline their intent to not compete as a member of the State Team. The athlete may compete as an All Star if she qualifies at State meet. (6/19/14)

Xcel Regionals will utilize two meet referees at Xcel Regionals. The first Xcel Regional meet referee to be from the home state and that the second meet referee to be RTCC. (6/18/15)

The number of gymnasts at Xcel Regionals is 1550 + all ties. The number of team members is 64 (8 per state with 4 scores counting for State team for all division except Diamond where 3 scores will count). There are no petitions accepted to Xcel Regionals. Each state turns into RACC the number of Xcel athletes in their state with 34.00 AA by Division by the designated deadline. A percentage for each division for each state is figured for the 1,550* places from all 8 states. The breakdown per division follows. (6/7/18) (6/27/19) (6/23)

Sapphires must score a 34.00 AA at state meet or may petition with a 35.00 AA. They must follow petition procedures. (12/23)

No open scoring at Xcel Regionals. (6/16/16)

If a state does not have 3 or more Diamonds to make up a State Team then the athlete with the top All Around score may compete as an All Star at Xcel Regionals.

If a state with only 8 qualified athletes has a scratch, they may replace that athlete to fill the spot on the state team. (6/28/22)

Xcel athletes residing in a state that does not offer <u>all</u> divisions of Xcel at a State Championship, then Xcel athletes in <u>any</u> division in that state may qualify to Xcel Regional Championships by scoring 1.00 higher than the regional qualifying score for their division in 2 sanctioned meets using a 2 judge panel. Documentation must be sent to the SACC.(6/19/14)

The RACC will do the draw for Xcel Regionals by computer program before the first competition

day. The athletes starting events are subject to change to expedite the competition after the coaches meeting. (6/20/13)

Eight gymnasts comprise a state's team for Xcel Regional in each division with 4 scores counting. (6/11/09) Diamond State Team competition will count 4 scores. (6/19/14) (6/7/18) (6/28/22)

Beginning with 2019 Xcel Regionals the format for qualifying to Xcel Regionals will be changed to one like the Levels 6,7,8 Regional Percentage format. No scratch and replacement procedure will be used. (6/7/18)

The 2 judges per state be selected by each state's administrative Committee. (7/15/21)

If a tie for state team occurs at Xcel Regionals Team competition the tie will not be broken. (7/9/03)

Xcel State teams to be filled even if athletes score is below the State Cut-off score for that Division. Once a team is filled all additional athletes must achieve the State Cut-off score to attend Regionals. (6/22/17)

If a gymnast's Regional Meet entry is NOT turned in online by the deadline, in order to enter the gymnast(s) in the Regional Meet, the following penalty will apply to the coach:

TOPS National Team Members from the current or previous year be permitted to register for the Regional 8/9/10 training camp. (12/16/00)

Petitions will be considered for acceptance to the training camps. Petitions are to be sent to the RTCC and a copy to RJOCC and reviewed under normal Rules & Policies petition guidelines. (7/9/03)

Level 6 - All Level 6 gymnast who qualify to Regional Meet are permitted to register for the Level 6/7/8 Regional Training Camp. (7/9/03) (8/9/12)

Level 7 - All Level 7 gymnast who qualify to the State Meet and above are permitted to register for the Level 6/7/8 Regional Training Camp. (7/9/03) (8/9/12)

Level 8 - All Level 8 gymnast who qualify to the State Meet and above are permitted to register for the Level 6/7/8 Regional Training Camp. (7/9/03)

Level 8 - All Level 8 gymnasts who qualified to Regionals at State Meet are eligible for the 8/9/10 camp. (6/7/00)

Level 9 - All Level 9 gymnasts who qualified to Regionals at State Meet, who competed at Regionals, or had petitions accepted to Regionals are eligible for the 8/9/10 camp (6/7/00)

Level 9 Eastern and JO National qualifiers are eligible for the 8/9/10 camp, National Team camp or both. (6/27/96)

Level 10 - All Level 10 gymnasts who qualified to Regionals at State Meet, who competed at Regionals, or had petitions accepted to Regionals are eligible for the 8/9/10 camp (6/7/00)

Elite - all current Elite gymnasts would be eligible for the 8/9/10. (6/27/96)

No fees will be paid for clinician service at training camps. Services will be donated to the region in order to use this as a fund-raiser for the Regional Apparel Fund. (6/27/96) (7/15/21)

CRITERIA FOR PETITION CONSIDERATION FOR Region 8 NATIONAL TEAM TRAINING CAMP

Petitions will be considered if:

1) A gymnast was injured during the same year as the camp and achieved the AA score of 37.00 + (during that year) at a sanctioned competition.
2) A gymnast qualified to the previous year's National Meet at the same level as they are when petitioning.

JUDGING ASSIGNMENTS

Judge from 2019 Xcel Regionals who was found to have unprofessional behavior as a chief judge will not be assigned to a Region 8 Regional Competition in 2020 and if assigned in 2021, 2022, or 2023 will not be assigned as a chief judge. (6/27/20)

Judges will be assigned to Level 9/10 Regionals by the percent athletes that qualified to the previous year's Level 9/10 Regionals beginning with 2020 Level 9/10 Regionals. (12/4/18)

Region 8 Committee will not accept any late applications for National Judges Applications. (5/2020)

The Region 8 Committee will use a 4-year rotation plan beginning 2020-2023 for assigning the Eastern and JO national meets – the Current National judges in the eastern rotation will be added to the JO National rotation. All Region 8 National Judges will be sent applications in February by RTCC – Judges that wish to be considered for selection to be added to the National eligible list will need to submit application by deadline date – the committee will select the final list of National rated judges to judge Eastern and JO Nationals. (12/4/18)

Judges selected for the National Rotation (JO Nationals or Easterns) must re-apply for consideration in each subsequent cycle.

The procedure used for the first draw follows:

JO Nationals

- 1. Drew 2 Brevets and 2 Nationals from separate hats for 2020.
- 2. If the judge drawn from the hat had a national assignment in 2019, the judge was moved to the next year.
- 3. If the next judge drawn from the hat was from the same state as the previous judge(s) drawn, the judge was moved to the next available year.
- 4. This process resulted in all eligible judges (n = 16) being assigned to one National meet in the four-year period.
- 5. Note: Mary Lou and Toni asked to be removed from the rotation; Deb asked to be an alternate in all years unless she was needed.

Easterns

- 1. Drew 1 Brevet from a hat for each of the four years to ensure Region 8 would have a judge eligible to be Chief Judge at Easterns.
- 2. Put all remaining Brevets, Nationals, and the four "New Judge" slips in one hat and draw for remaining years.
- 3. If judge had a national assignment in 2019, the judge was moved to the next year.
- If the next judge drawn was from the same state as a judge already drawn for a particular year, the judge was moved to a different year.
- This process resulted in 16 of the 19 eligible judges being assigned to one Eastern meet in the four-year period.

Alternates

- 1. Judges were assigned to alternate slots in years in which they were not judging Nationals or Easterns.
- 2. Judges who were not drawn to judge Easterns were given an extra alternate spot if possible.
- 3. The alternate list can be used to help the committee select replacements based on state and rating (Brevet or National) of the judge to be replaced or may be selected on other criteria as appropriate (e.g. geographic location, availability, etc.) (6/27/19).
- 4. The Committee decided to select alternate judges on an annual basis rather than project four-year assignments for alternates.
- Note: Because there were more judges eligible for assignment to Easterns than there were slots available, three judges in the rotation did not receive an Easterns assignment. The Committee agreed that these three judges would be given priority consideration for Easterns if a slot became available and if they met the criteria for replacing that slot. In addition, One judge had to decline Easterns in 2020 and she was added to the list for consideration for a future Easterns assignment.

If a Regional judging emergency occurs within 24 hours of a Regional meet, the Regional Committee shall give authority to the RTCC to adjust assignments. If possible the RTCC shall contact other Regional Committee officers. (6/17/10)

Region 8 will use NAWGJ as the regional judging contractor. (6/23)

All Judging Availability Forms, In-Gym Cards and Tracking form for regional assignments must be received by the appropriate recipient (RTCC and RJD) by the deadline date to be considered for Regional Assignments (10/10/03)

Tracking numbers on the Judge Regional Availability form should include numbers from Invitational and State Meets only. (No Regionals) (6/19/14)

Judging contracts for Regionals must be received by the deadline indicated on the contract or the contract is void. The RJD will go to the next designated alternate in consultation with the RTCC. (12/19/03)

In unusual gymnastics related circumstances, the Regional Committee delegates last minute assignment decisions to Region 8 Committee. (6/2/04)

The number of judging slots for Eastern Nationals and JO Nationals received by Region 8 will be filled based on the number of judges in the National judges' rotation. Should a judge who is in a slot eligible for assignment make the decision not to take the assignment, or not judge once assigned, the judge may be added as an alternate in a subsequent year. The Region 8 USA Gymnastics Committee will make a decision about a future assignment, if any, on a case-by-case basis. (12/10/19)

The name of the Brevet/National that did not fulfill an assignment should be shared with the Region 8 Committee prior to the current year discussion. Decisions about a future assignment will be on case by case basis.

Extenuating Circumstances: Should an emergency situation occur and cause the assigned Brevet to miss his/her assignment, an alternate judge will be assigned from those eligible in the National Rotation. The situation will be presented to the Region 8 committee to determine if the affected judge will be added as an alternate in a future year or given an assignment should a slot become available. (12/10/19)

CRITERIA FOR NATIONAL ASSIGNMENTS

The Region 8 Committee will use a 4-year rotation plan beginning 2020-2023 for assigning the Eastern and JO national meets – the Current National judges in the eastern rotation will be added to the JO National rotation. All Region 8 National Judges will be sent applications in February 2019 by RTCC – Judges that wish to be considered for selection to be added to the National eligible list will need to submit application by deadline date – the committee will select the final list of National rated judges to judge Eastern and JO Nationals. (12/4/18)

In gym experience per existing regional guidelines every year. (12/20/02)

Volunteer to host, teach or work actively with the athletes at Level 8/9/10 or National Team Region 8 training camp fulfilling four 8 hours tracks in 4 years (March 2020 amendment to December 2019 motion) Note: makes new requirement comparable to prior requirement of attending training camp at least once every two years but eliminates required attendance from start to finish at camp). In the case of a valid conflict, a written request for a waiver may be submitted with the Availability Form to RTCC. Requests for waiver will then be submitted to the Regional Committee. (1/9/99) (12/20/02) (11/6/04) (12/14/07)(12/10/19)

If a National or Brevet judge does not fulfill and submit documentation of fulfilling the Junior Olympic Judging Assignment criteria for 2 years in a row, then he/she would be removed from the rotation order for Eastern/National eligibility. If he/she requests to be placed back in the rotation, a written request must be submitted to the Region 8 Committee with availability and, if accepted, the judge may be considered as an alternate in the four-year rotation drawn for the current cycle or given an assignment if a slot becomes available. (6/19/14) (12/10/19)

Judge, coach or work in a regional administrative capacity at Regional Championship in the current year and 1 of the 2 prior years. (12/20/02).

If a judge recommended to Nationals does not judge at Regionals, the committee will replace that judge unless it decides, based on financial considerations, to keep the original judge. (6/30/99)

International judging assignments supersede Region 8 Judging assignments. (6/2/04)

No more than one-half of the Level 10 National judges recommended from Region 8 will be from the same state. (6/2/04)

Actively judging at the Junior Olympic level as required by Rules and Policies.

Any judge who does not meet the regional criteria for assignment for JO Nationals or Easterns for two consecutive years be removed from the rotation list. (8/9/12)

If a JO National meet or an Eastern national meet is held in Region 8, at least one judge recommended will reflect representation from hosts geographical area. (6/2/04)

The first year that a Brevet judge, who has moved to Region 8, fulfills the regional criteria then said Brevet judge's name will be placed at the bottom of the Eastern/National rotation list and added to the draw for the next four-year rotation or eligible for consideration as an alternate within the current four-year rotation. (8/9/12) (12/10/19)

If a judge submits Regional availability, receives an assignment and declines the contract, the judge will not receive any Regional Assignments for the next competitive year. Judges need to inform the RTCC and RJD of any change in availably prior to Region 8 Congress to avoid this penalty. (12/12/15)

GAT symposium (Gymnastics Association of Texas) as an approved clinic for the Regional Availability criteria. (6/16/16)

PROCEDURE

The Regional Committee will decide upon judges' assignments for each national and regional meet independently. Every attempt will be made to assign different judges to Level 10 Nationals and Level 9 Eastern Nationals within each year.

The order is as follows:

- Level 10 Nationals
- Level 9 Easterns
- Level 9/10 Regionals
- Level 6/7/8 Regionals
- Level Xcel Regionals (7/14/11)

Judges attending the 6/7/8 Training Camp be permitted to use that to satisfy their clinic attendance requirement for assignment to the following year's regional Level 6/7/8 and/or Xcel meet. (1/4/97) (7/17/08)

APPAREL

Level 6, 7 & 8 State Teams to Level 6/7/8 Regionals must have a minimum of competitive leotard provided by SACC at no cost to those athletes or their parents. (6/17/98)

RJOCC will provide sample apparel with sample sizes at Region 8 Committee December meeting each

year for Region 8 Committee to decide on apparel to be distributed at the next year's Regionals. Athletes and coaches will be available for sizing. (6/28/06)

The USA Gymnastics State Accounts will pay a fine of \$100.00 for the first occurrences if one of its coach's/club's does not wear the Regional apparel at Easterns or Nationals. Fine will be increased for subsequent occurrences. (6/20/13)

In order for coaches to receive apparel for Easterns and DP Nationals the club must be in "Good Standing".

"In Good Standing" is defined as:

- Host a Regional Training Camp within the last 2 years OR
- 2. Send volunteer coaches to a Regional Training Camp to actively work with gymnasts within the last 2 years OR
- 3. Send athletes to a Regional Training Camp within the last 2 years OR
- 4. Make a \$1,000 donation to the Regional Apparel Fund. (Prior to start of Regional Championships)
 Coaches of clubs that are not in "Good Standing" must purchase apparel by paying \$200 (1 day of competition), \$250 (2 days of competition), or \$300 (3 days of competition) per coach for the appropriate apparel and must wear apparel at Easterns and JO Nationals or their state will be fined. (6/16/16) (6/22/17)

Regional apparel as follows:

- All athletes competing at JO Nationals receive a base set of apparel. Level 9 Eastern National qualifiers will receive apparel as designated. Level 9 Eastern apparel package include a tank leotard for the qualifying gymnasts. (12/19/03) (6/7/18)
- All judges who worked at a regional training camp and are assigned to judge Level 10 JO Nationals or Level 9 Easterns will receive apparel. (12/18/08)
- 3. Apparel items will be offered for sale. (12/18/08)
- 4. Apparel will be provided to the current members of the Regional Committee. (12/18/08)
- 5. Coaches who worked Training Camp will receive a Region 8 gift. (12/18/08)
- 6. Warm-up Jackets are provided for a twoyear period. (12/18/08) An active elite gymnast who has qualified to a Classic or

higher competition may receive Region 8 apparel. (12/3/12)

ANNUAL REPORT

State Chairmen must submit an annual summary report. Office equipment purchases, the state chair is responsible for sending a copy of the annual equipment form to the RACC by July 10th of each year. (8/21/98) (12/20/02)

ALL STAR TRIP

All Star Trip will be reinstated for 2020. (12/10/19) All Star Trip will be suspended for 2020 due to COVID-19. (3/25/20)

In order to qualify for the All-Star Trip a gymnast's coach/gym needs to be in good standing with the Region. Athletes from gyms not in Good Standing are ineligible for the All-Star Trip.

In Good Standing means:

- Host a Regional Training Camp within the last 2 years
- Send volunteer coaches to a Regional Training Camp to actively work with gymnasts within the last 2 years
- Send athletes to a Regional Training Camp within the last 2 years
- Make a \$1,000 donation to the Regional Apparel Fund (12/18/08) (Prior to start of Regional Championships)

Qualification Procedures for All-Star Trip:

The Region 8 All-Star Team will be comprised of:

- 6 Level 9's from Eastern Championships.
- 6 Level 10's from JO Nationals.

Level 9 Selection:

Any athlete(s) that place(s) first in the AA get(s) first priority.

If there are still spots available, the athlete(s) with the highest AA score(s) regardless of Age Group will make up the remainder of the team. In the case of an AA tie for the last spot,

the highest individual event score would break the tie.

Level 10 Selection:

Any athlete(s) that place(s) first in the AA get(s) first priority.

Any athlete(s) that place(s) second in the AA get second priority.

Any athlete(s) that place(s) third in the AA get third priority.

Any athlete(s) that place(s) fourth in the AA get fourth priority.

If there are still spots available, the athlete(s) with the highest AA score(s) regardless of Age Group will make up the remainder of the team. In the case of an AA tie for the last spot,

the highest individual event score would break the tie.

Graduating Seniors are ineligible for the trip.

Athletes from clubs that are not in "good standing" in regard to training camps are ineligible for the trip.

Athletes that are under the age of 15 must be accompanied by a coach or parent.

All Athletes are expected to abide by the USA

Gymnastics Code of Ethics and the Athlete

Responsibilities outlined under Athlete Membership
at all times during the All-Star Trip.
